Fr Peter's Message for Sunday May 12th 2024

My Dear Friends,

We are in that time of waiting, between Ascension Day and Pentecost. The followers of Jesus know that something exciting is about to come; they know that they will have an experience of great power, an experience that will launch them on a new life; they know that there will be no going back to the old way of living. It will all be very, very new - and both exciting and frightening in equal measure. They cannot have known (although, knowing what had happened to their Master, they might have guessed) that this new way of life would lead each of them, in their different ways, towards a cross of their own.

What might have been going through their minds in these days of waiting? I imagine that they would have spent a lot of time together, telling the old stories of all that Jesus had done, reminding one another of everything that he had said. This is the calm before the storm, and they would have realised that they needed to use the time wisely. Through their prayer, and their discussions, and their retelling of the story, they would be getting a clearer and clearer picture in their minds of what Jesus really meant to them. They would be going out to proclaim him to the nations and they would want to have a very clear message to proclaim - no ambiguity, no contradictions, no confusion.

In fact, spending some time asking ourselves 'Who is this Jesus, what does he mean to me, why does he matter so much, why do I choose to build my life around him?' is something that all of us could usefully do. Like the apostles, we need to carry the message of Jesus Christ into a very needy world; in places the world is very dark, and it needs us to carry his light there. What is the message that we carry? How will it influence our lives, how will it change what we choose, what we do?

I have included below a meditation by St Teresa of Calcutta that you might find helpful. Some of it might seem quite obvious, some of it more surprising. But I do suggest that you spend a few minutes with it, and use it as a focus for your own prayer, your own reflection. Who is Jesus to me? The answer that we give to that question might make a real difference to how we live our lives; it might make us more like the apostles as they set off into the world with their message of delight and salvation.

Who is Jesus to Me? A Meditation by St Mother Teresa

Who is Jesus to me? Jesus is the Word made Flesh. Jesus is the Bread of Life. Jesus is the Victim offered for our sins on the Cross. Jesus is the Sacrifice at Holy Mass for the sins of the world and mine.

Jesus is the Word – to be spoken. Jesus is the Truth – to be told. Jesus is the Way – to be walked. Jesus is the Light – to be lit. Jesus is the Life – to be loved. Jesus is the Joy – to be shared. Jesus is the Sacrifice – to be given. Jesus is the Bread of Life – to be eaten.

Jesus is the Hungry – to be fed. Jesus is the Thirsty – to be satiated. Jesus is the Naked – to be clothed. Jesus is the Homeless – to be taken in. Jesus is the Sick – to be healed. Jesus is the Lonely – to be loved. Jesus is the Unwanted – to be wanted. Jesus is the Leper – to wash his wounds. Jesus is the Beggar – to give him a smile. Jesus is the Drunkard – to listen to him.

Jesus is the Little One – to embrace him. Jesus is the Dumb – to speak to him. Jesus is the Crippled – to walk with him. Jesus is the Drug Addict – to befriend him. Jesus is the Prostitute – to remove from danger and befriend her. Jesus is the Prisoner – to be visited. Jesus is the Old – to be served.

To me Jesus is my God, Jesus is my Spouse, Jesus is my Life, Jesus is my only Love, Jesus is my All in All, Jesus is my Everything. Amen.
